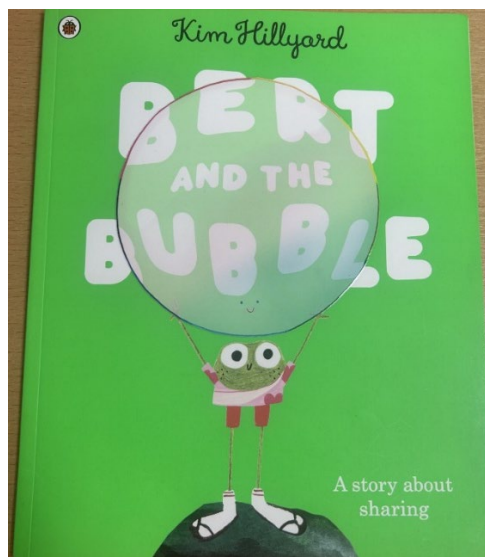


## Newsletter 31 – Friday, 22<sup>nd</sup> May 2026
